



Blockchain Services Award

Description of Award Category

The **Blockchain Services Award** is an organizational award for providers of blockchain technologies and services. It recognizes a company, government agency, or nongovernmental entity delivering blockchain solutions to transform its clients and their operations, supply chains, or ecosystems. This award celebrates the tangible and long-term change that the blockchain service provider is working to support.

Application questions:

1. Provide a summary of the organization you are nominating for this award, including relevant products/services, size, and customers/audience. We may use this information on the W3B Awards website and/or print materials. (This question will not be scored. Limit 1000 characters)

Does it use, build upon, or adapt an existing protocol (e.g., Bitcoin, DAG, Ethereum, Hashgraph, Hyperledger, other)? (Limit 2500 characters)
4. How does this company's blockchain infrastructure, platform, or service demonstrate an approach that is innovative? List ways in which the solution is original, provides users with a competitive advantage, and addresses such implementation challenges such as diffusion/adoption, regulatory uncertainty, governance, scalability, and interoperability with other blockchains. (Limit 2500 characters)
5. Please share one to three pieces of **quantitative** evidence (with accompanying sources) in support of this nomination. Examples of quantitative data include market growth, number of new partnerships formed, customer retention rate, number of patents filed or awarded, or other numeric data.
